Broadbent Vinho Verde

Broadbent Vinho Verde is from the green area of Portugal, just north of Porto. It is spritzy and bright with notes of minerality, green apple, and citrus. Perfect for fresh seafood, salads, and Saturday afternoons.



Broadbent Vinho Verde Rosé

Broadbent Vinho Verde Rose is also from the green area of Portugal, just north of Porto. It is vibrant and effervescent with notes of strawberry, pomegranate, and orange zest. Pairs well with cheese plates, barbecue chicken wings, and ham sandwiches.



J. Portugal Ramos Reserve Red

From the center of Portugal, the Alentejo, this red blend has a long finish with flavors of ripe red fruits and dried herbs with a touch of smokiness. Try it with spaghetti with red sauce and brisket.



Duorum Altitude

Duorum Altitude comes from the birthplace of Port wine, the Douro Valley, but couldn't be more different from its sweet cousin. Full bodied and balanced, this wine highlights purple plum and blackberry alongside light notes of violets and raspberries. Compliments burgers, blue cheese, and lamb very well.
